

## About the Author/Illustrator


Keith Duquette was an impressionable child who at various times wanted to be a pet-shop owner, an architect, a painter, an anthropologist, a cartoonist, a naturalist, and a center fielder for the New York Yankees. He is now none of those things. But he draws on all these early influences in creating picture books.

## My Presentation

A reading of the book is supplemented by a discussion using flashcard images of additional fascinating and revealing animal names. A question and answer segment follows where topics like: animal behavior, the environment, and the creative process I went through in making the book are discussed. The program concludes with an animal name game. Using a selection of drawings of animals, in a coloring book style, students are asked to create their own descriptive names and images, learning first hand the rich relationship between our language and the animal kingdom.

**Presentation Length: 45 - 60 minutes • Preferred number of children per session: 40 or less**


## Presentation Flashcards
